Prince in India prophesied to be a great ruler or a great prophet

Father sheltered him from old age, disease, death, and religious renunciation

On a chariot ride at the age of 30, Hindu gods manifested themselves as the 4 banished influences.

Shortly thereafter began a life of searching for enlightenment through Hindu study and then asceticism





7 years later...


Achieved enlightenment while after meditating under a fig tree for 40 days.


Buddha – "enlightened/awakened one"

Began teaching a philosophy of the "Middle Way" in 525 BC




What Buddha taught (The Four Noble Truths): •To Live is to Suffer Suffering is Caused by Desire •One can Eliminate Suffering by Eliminating Desire • Desire is Eliminated by means of the "Middle Way", or Noble Eightfold Path






What Buddha taught (The Noble Eightfold Path): Right View – of existence Right Intention Right Speech — saying all that is, and only what is, required and only what is, required

Right Action – doing all that is,



What Buddha taught (The Noble Eightfold Path): Right Livelihood – monk Right Mindfulness – meditation Right Concentration – maintaining continuous focus Right Effort – directing one's energy properly (to alleviate hurts)

Died eating spoiled pork that had been presented to him as an offering. Entered nirvana while his followers watched him.



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
Philosophical Atheism Sunyata ("The Void") -Nothing, Love, Compassion

Is Buddha god? No...and yes



GOC Buddhas are enlightened humans who are still only part of the ultimate reality (nothingness, love, etc.)



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Some branches of Buddhism worship a buddha as a deity



God

Bodhisattvas are savior type demi-gods or gods who help others achieve salvation



esus No place at all in traditional teachings Teacher, Buddha in waiting (bodhisattva)

Salvation "To live is to suffer..." Life and it's desires/attachments keep us from becoming one with the ultimate non-reality (sunyata)

Salvation

Reincarnation (samsara) is a negative concept, a repeat of life that equals continued suffering



Salvation is... Release

(nirvana –literally "blowing out the flame of desire")

from the cycle of reincarnation via karma

Salvation

karma - the sum of a person's actions in this and previous states of existence, viewed as deciding their fate in future existences.

Salvation good karma is earned by... The Eightfold Path Works, Monasticism Worship of a deity, buddha, book

Eternity Ultimate goal is to lose individuality and find release from samsara by joining again with ultimate non-reality (nothing, force, love, compassion)
