Lament – “My life is broken. Save me!”

Wisdom – “Even when life seems broken, you are saving me!”



Imprecatory-

“The World is broken!
Judge it and save your
people!”



Imprecatory Psalms

can be a subset of nearly any other
Psalm type, especially lament

5, 6, 11, 12, 35, 37, 40, 52, 54, 56, 57, 58,
59, 69, 79, 83, 94, 109, 137, 139



imprecation – curse
that invokes
misfortune or
judgement upon
someone, usually
based on their
character or actions

Psalm 11:5 (CSB)

The LORD examines the
righteous, but he hates
the wicked and those who
love violence.



Psalm 137:9 (CSB)

Happy is he who takes
your little ones and
dashes them against
the rocks.



Psalm 139:19–22 (CSB)

God, if only you would kill the wicked—
you bloodthirsty men, stay away from
me—who invoke you deceitfully. Your
enemies swear by you falsely.

LORD, don't I hate those who hate you,
and detest those who rebel against you?

I hate them with extreme hatred; I
consider them my enemies.

John 2:17 (CSB)

And his disciples remembered that it
is written: Zeal for your house will
consume me.

Psalm 69:9 (CSB)

because zeal for your house has
consumed me, and the insults of those
who insult you have fallen on me.



Romans 12:9 (CSB)

Let love be without hypocrisy.
Detest evil; cling to what is good.

Righteous Judge



Jude 9 (CSB)

Yet when Michael the archangel was disputing with the devil in an argument about Moses's body, he did not dare utter a slanderous condemnation against him but said, "The Lord rebuke you!"

Romans 12:19 (CSB)

Friends, do not avenge yourselves; instead, leave room for God's wrath, because it is written, Vengeance belongs to me; I will repay, says the Lord.



They remind us that
Jesus has absorbed
the wrath of God on
our behalf



Isaiah 53:4–5 (CSB)

Yet he himself bore our sicknesses,
and he carried our pains; but we in
turn regarded him stricken, struck
down by God, and afflicted.

But he was pierced because of our
rebellion, crushed because of our
iniquities; punishment for our
peace was on him, and we are
healed by his wounds.



Romans 5:10 (CSB)

For if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, then how much more, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life.



2 Corinthians 5:21 (CSB)

He made the one who
did not know sin to be
sin for us, so that in him
we might become the
righteousness of God.



1 Timothy 1:15 (CSB)

This saying is trustworthy and
deserving of full acceptance:
“Christ Jesus came into the
world to save sinners”—and I
am the worst of them.
